### THANKSGIVING MC QUESTIONS

This week we celebrate Thanksgiving. There is no greater expression of the Gospel than thankful worship! Even if your group isn't meeting this week, please take some time to go through question #1. You can do it as an impromptu gathering, over text or however you are able to connect with your group.

If you have time, we've also included questions from this week's sermon. There's no "right" way to run your MC this week. Pray for your group and ask the Spirit to show you which questions to focus on this week.

1. Without a doubt, this has been one of the craziest years of our lifetime. And yet, we have a ton to be thankful for. What are you thankful for?
2. Think through the Gospel for a moment and slowly list out the blessings that we have in Christ. Now think about what we've done to deserve these blessings? How does thinking about these two contrasting thoughts make you more thankful?
3. Let's take time this week to thank God for our blessings.

### SERMON QUESTIONS

1. God is revealing our "cornerstones" right now. You can identify them by what is causing anxiety, stress or fear. What "cornerstone" is Jesus trying to shake right now?
2. Pastor Ryan said that Peter and John were bold because they had great assurance from the Gospel. We often think we need more boldness when what we really need is greater assurance. What is something that you need to remember about the Gospel that would make you unshakable?
